Country: Germany Directed by: Sandor Jesse, Ute von Münchow-Pohl Genre: Cartoon, children Screening Time: 12:50-14:10


Little Raven, known from Nele Moost and Annet Rudolph's children's books, accidentally destroys the animals' shared food supply. To make up for the damage, Little Raven and his friends take part in a fast-paced rally race around the forest, the prize money of which would allow him to replenish the food supply again. The film tells a powerful story about finding one's calling, acceptance and the importance of teamwork.



The Bare Heart

The forest can do without humans - but humans cannot do without the forest. The film shows the challenges facing our forests due to drought, bark beetles and environmental disasters.



The Last Wish (Special guest film)

Country: Finland Directed by: Rax Rinnekangas Genre: Dramatic narrative Screening Time: 16:10-18:35

During the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Ángel Flores, a promising Spanish actor returns to Spain to fulfill the last dying wish of his theatre master Miguel Lama: to travel to a remote monastery up in the mountains of Northern Spain and there to read each page of Dostoyevsky's thousand-page-novel The Brothers Karamazov three times, then to come to his graveside in the monastery cemetery every night to tell him about the progress made in reading the novel.

The Last Wish is a dynamic, all-new dramatic narrative by its story that pays homage to both Italian neorealism, classic theatre and anti-war attitude and for the need for sacred silence. One message of the film is that we all – all the children of this common world – already exist in the authentic books and therefore the great world literature will save us and the world.



In the Land of Palm Oil

Country: United States Directed by: Denise Dragiewicz Genre: Environmental awareness Screening Time: 18:50–20:10


In the Land of Palm Oil focuses on the casualties, both human and environmental, of palm oil exploitation in Indonesia. The film fuses first-hand accounts of villagers - victims of land-grabbing by large global corporations who pay off local and national officials and vérité observations of young Dayak activists who are trying to expose the brutal human rights violations. Emmanuela Shinta, a rising Dayak activist, sees video and social media exposure as the key to holding her government to account. Acting as an eyewitness to both the civil rights abuses and the environmental degradation, Shinta and her team visit Dayak villagers to record their experiences and ride along with firefighting teams during the dry seasons to expose the tragic consequences of the modern-day palm oil empire in her home province of Central Kalimantan (Indonesian Borneo).



Impivaara - A New World

Brothers escape to the virgin forests of Impivaara to create a new world. An experimental imagining of Finnish national author Aleksis Kivi's novel Seven Brothers (1870) for the 21st Century, focusing on the energetic basis of a Northern welfare state and a possible future emerging from the climate crisis.



Trouble

Country: Ireland Directed by: Jonathan Shaw Genre: Drama Screening Time: 21:00–21:20

A tense civil war drama capturing the fear and resolve of the Irish people for independence.

The Old Young Crow

In the twilight of his life, Mehrdad, now an elderly man, reminisces about his transformative journey from Iran to Japan, a poignant odyssey that began in the wake of his mother's passing when he was just a young boy. His narrative unfolds around a heartwarming encounter with an elderly Japanese woman, forged amidst the hushed serenity of a graveyard and facilitated by the pages of his cherished sketchbook.

Giant's Kettle

Somewhere up north at the age of peak modern there is a man longing for connection but unable to break loose, and a woman feeling alien to the world which has everything figured out for her, without her.





Boxer Theory

A sensitive investigative film shot on farms in the south of France facing the shock of climate breakdown. A stimulating reflection on agricultural revolutions in progress and the food resilience of the territories.

Country: France Directed by: Saeed Nouri Genre: Documentary Screening Time: 14:55-15:10



Imaginative Lycke, 8 years old, sees her grandad, Fafa, fall ill after stepping into an elf ring (a ring of mushrooms). She believes she can keep Fafa away from the hospital by finding a magical cure from the dark and scary Finnish forest.




Lunatic

Country: Netherlands Directed by: Robin Noorda Genre: Animation, serious environmental comedy Screening Time: 15:35–15:50

The film tackles urgent earthly issues, as seen by a lonely astronaut, called Antonio, who was left behind on the moon after his coming out.

The Moon Guard, a statue of a skinned warrior rising from the moon's surface, symbolises defence against the danger of space debris from above. In addition to the climate crisis, human waste, even in space, determines our fate. Ultimately, collisions between space debris and satellites will cause a cascade of collisions that will destroy all communications. It's called Kessler syndrome. The earth ends up with a Saturn like dust ring of metal and silicon. Antonio is aware of these problems and as he puts it: "It is one small scrap by man, one giant heap by mankind." He tries to do some terra forming on the moon and finally he meets the allknowing 'I am Al' who also happens to be the voice over.



GUAÑUNA

Country: Ecuador Directed by: David Lasso Genre: Drama, thriller Screening Time: 16:15–17:30

Paul was 16 years old when he was captured by the Police while writing on a wall. The next day he was found dead in the ravine of his town. His father led an intense social struggle to seek justice, which brought together hundreds of young people from urban tribes, achieving a sentence of 20 years in prison for the three police officers involved. However, after three years they were released.



ZOOMERS

In the gripping story set in Myanmar, seven young individuals with diverse backgrounds are brought together by a shared passion for freedom and an unwavering commitment to revolution. The captivating journey of each story will delve into the profound exploration of personal experiences. They have willingly sacrificed their futures, fame, lives, families, homes, and possessions, and they know that losses may outweigh any gains. Driven by the collective efforts of each person involved, the revolution perseveres. Unyielding and steadfast, they vow to continue fighting until victory is achieved.

Joutseno College
